ORDER


Upon consideration of the Defendants' Unopposed Motion to Amend Protective Order, it is hereby ORDERED that Paragraph 1 of the Protective Order signed by the Court on May 12, 2005, and entered on May 13, 2005, is AMENDED to read as follows:

1. For purposes of this Order, the term "Protected Information" shall mean:
 - (a) the names of lower-level non-supervisory attorneys, investigative agents, or support personnel;
 - (b) records of telephone calls or summaries or analyses thereof;
 - (c) unpublished telephone numbers identified as belonging to the U.S. Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (collectively, the "Agency Defendants"), or any person whose name is protected under paragraph (a);
 - (d) responses to Requests 18-32 of Plaintiff's First Set of Requests for Admission regarding items discovered by law enforcement officials during any search of Peck Chegne's properties;

- (e) the videotape deposition of Robert S. Muller, III, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and
- (f) the January 18, 2003 statements of former personnel of the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia which may contain information subject to 5 U.S.C. § 552a(b),

to the extent the Agency Defendants may disclose such information during discovery and specifically identify the information as "Protected Information"; *provided, however*, that the information described in paragraph (e) shall be protected without regard to whether it was "disclosed" by the Agency Defendants, and *provided further* that certain information may be excluded from the class of "Protected Information" by agreement of the parties, whenever the information is of such relevance that treatment of such information as "Protected Information" would unduly inhibit the progress of discovery.
